Chicago HOPES for Kids Receives Grant from SC Johnson

Funding will support remote education opportunities for homeless students during COVID-19

CHICAGO, Illinois - Chicago HOPES for Kids is pleased to announce it has received a grant from SC Johnson to support our virtual academic support program for children experiencing homelessness in Chicago during COVID-19.

The \$12,500 grant will support our ongoing efforts to distribute technology and ensure WiFi access for families living in homeless shelters across Chicago, as well as the creation and distribution of online learning resources to supplement students' remote learning. These online resources include recorded read-aloud videos of age-appropriate books and regular distribution of curated educational activities via email and on our website, www.ChicagoHOPESforKids.org/parent-resources. On average, students experiencing homelessness fall 1-2 grade levels behind their peers due to the trauma of homelessness. Without targeted educational support, they are at risk of falling even further behind during a period of remote learning.

Virtual support will continue until it is safe to resume in-person programs, and our program staff are continuously innovating new ways to connect with students.
